

## Hosting a Book Event in Support of Health Care Financing Reform

## Suggested Outline for a Book Event:

- 1. Introductions and Ice breakers
- 2. Goals of the event
  - a. Get to know each other and build relationships
  - b. Update on current legislation
  - c. Actions we will take together
- **3.** Why did you come today? Share your health care stories.
- 4. Share and discuss "Principles for Health Care" from *Healing Health Care* by John Marty (available for free download at: <a href="https://www.mnhealthplan.org">www.mnhealthplan.org</a>) or have copies available
  - a. Ensure that all people are covered
  - b. Cover all types of care, including dental, vision, hearing, mental health, chemical dependency treatment, prescription drugs, medical equipment and supplies, long term care and home care
  - c. Allow patients to choose their providers
  - d. Reduce costs by cutting administrative bureaucracy, not by restricting or denying care
  - e. Set premiums based on ability to pay
  - f. Focus on preventative care and early intervention to improve health
  - g. Ensure there are enough healthcare providers to guarantee access to timely care
  - h. Continue Minnesota's leadership in medical education, research and technology
  - i. Provide adequate and timely payments to providers
  - j. Use a simple funding and payment system
  - k. Discussion questions:
    - i. How would a healthcare system based on these principles change the experience for you and your loved ones?
    - ii. How would a system based on these principles change your work as a nurse?
    - iii. Is there anything missing from this list that would make the healthcare system more fair and equitable?
- 5. Update on current state and federal legislation.
- 6. Discuss ways to take action:
  - a. Postcards- hand written, not scripted.
  - b. Phone calls- register your constituent opinions on specific legislation.
  - c. Lobby day- direct conversations with your legislator or staff person. Make appt.
  - d. Letters to the Editor, opinion pieces
  - e. Donate: to organizations working on Health Care for All
