Healthcare for People, not for Profit

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) passed at the federal level has improved the accessibility to healthcare. Unfortunately it has failed in addressing the costly healthcare system that is in place. Going forward, we need to preserve important patient protections while reforming how we pay for healthcare.

The free-market / profit based approach doesn't work for healthcare, costs continue to rise and more people can't afford to pay. Over 45,000 deaths occur every year because people cannot afford healthcare.¹

The growth in national health expenditures continues to consume more of our GDP; as of 2015 it was 17.8% of GDP up from 11.4% in 1990.² United States per capita healthcare spending (\$9,024) is more than twice the average (\$3,620) of other developed countries.³

31% of every healthcare dollar is spent on non-healthcare⁴: administration, advertising, high CEO / management salaries, profit making and other wasteful activities.
